Reception



Reception enjoyed getting out and about as we posted our Mother's Day cards and looked for signs of spring along the way! The children really took their time, observing spring flowers and chose to either paint or draw them for the front of their special cards.

The natural world was also a focus for World Book Day this year, using the fabulous Yuval Zommer text, 'The Wild'. The children carefully considered how 'The Wild' felt at different times and wrote speech bubbles to reflect the feelings of 'The Wild'. Our Live Simply pledge is to look after our Reception garden so we chose to pick up litter and brush up leaves as well as make placards to spread the message that we need to look after our wonderful world. 'Save The Wild!'

Year 1

Year 1 have loved exploring bread and sandwich fillings in design and technology this half term. To begin we enjoyed tasting ingredients before trying out our skills and then designing and making our own finished sandwiches. It was certainly tasty fun trying them out!

Our history topic has helped us understand all the different types of transport around us and how they have changed over time. We even used our learning to predict how transport might change in the future

Both our English texts have given us plenty of storytelling opportunities. First, we explored how "Nibbles the Book Monster" changed familiar stories in different ways. We then read 'Jim and the beanstalk' to explore another familiar story with a twist. This then led



us to plan and write our own episode from the story, creating different problems for Jim to solve.

Next term we are looking forward to our new art topic, exploring textiles and gaining inspiration from German textile artist Gunta Stolz.

Year 2

Year 2 had a fabulous time making dips and dippers in DT. We tried lots of yummy dips then we practised our cutting skills to make our own dippers. We cut up cucumber, peppers, celery and tomatoes. We even made our own class dip!

We have also been enjoying learning all about the Great Fire of London this term! The children turned into architects for the day to help design building for London after the fire. We talked about how to make them safe so that the great fire doesn't happen again.

During World books day, the children enjoyed reading, 'The Wild.' We learnt very important lessons about how to take care of our environment. We learnt that every little action makes a big difference. We all worked together to tidy our yard. It now looks much better and is a nice place to be.



Year 3

Year 3 have had the best time this term learning to master the Djembe drums. The children have worked hard on developing their skills and techniques in preparation for a final showcase to their parents. Mr Asbridge has taught them many rhythms and styles ensuring that confidence was built on each week. We are really proud of all the children and how much they have embraced this new instrument.



We have also been developing our sewing techniques this half term, creating wonderful money pouches. All the children had a chance to practise their threading and stitching techniques before finalising the details on their own bespoke pouch. The final products looked great as well as being practical too.

Year 4

Year 4 have had a great time this half term! We have enjoyed our weekly swimming lessons and have grown in confidence. We have also thoroughly enjoyed immersing ourselves into our learning during our English and History units focusing on the Titanic. It was fascinating to learn about how this disaster impacted the lives of so many and how many links Titanic had with Liverpool. In our Design and Technology lessons, we have worked to create our own mechanical toys. We used a range of equipment including saws, glue guns and hole punchers to create our own mini-masterpieces.



Year 5

What a wonderful half term we have had!

A highlight was definitely visiting the Western Approaches in Liverpool and deepening our learning on the battle of the Atlantic.

What an experience and privilege to be able to see somewhere that contributed to winning WWII. It is true to say that we have been completely absorbed in this topic.



We have also thoroughly enjoyed honing our cricket skills especially as the weather has been improving!

To add to our already limitless talents, we have been learning to compose vocally and using colour. We focussed on dynamics and pitch before performing as groups and then putting it all together as a class!



We have so much more to look forward to in the Summer Term, including venturing into space and sculpture inspired by Lutz Wagner aka Moto Waganari!

We have had such a fantastic half-term! As well as having so much fun working together in Military School, we have been learning all about the slave trade and how Liverpool was involved as a major port city - we were fascinated to learn about various street names in our city having links with slavery and we have been very mature in learning about this aspect of history. Healthy Lunchboxes

We encourage all our parents/carers who provide a packed lunch for their child to provide a balanced meal. Government guidelines recommend that a packed lunch should include:

- One portion of fruit or vegetables each day.
- Meat, fish or another source of non-dairy protein each day (e.g. lentils, beans, pulses, falafel).
- A starchy food each day e.g. rice, potatoes, pasta, noodles, couscous, cereals.
- A dairy food each day e.g. milk, cheese, yoghurt, fromage frais.
- An oily fish at least once every three weeks.
